Born on August 24th, 1955, into the esteemed lineage of Late Khalifah Mukadam Kareem Bello Of Ile Ntabo Compound Igbore, Abeokuta South Local Government Area of Ogun State, and Alhaja Zainab Kareem Bello Of Igasele Compound, Ita Otun Ado/Odo, Otta Local Government Area of Ogun State, Alhaji Tajudeen Adio Kareem's life was a remarkable tapestry of faith, leadership, and service.

Growing up as the eighth child of his father and the first child of his mother, Alhaji Tajudeen's journey was anchored in the values of his upbringing.
